
# **Europlanet Society Regional Hubs**

## What is the Europlanet Society?

The Europlanet Society promotes planetary sciences in Europe for the benefit of its community. The Society is open to both individuals and organisations. Launched in 2018, it builds on 15 years of successful Europlanet projects funded by the European Commission.

#### The Europlanet Society aims to:

- Expand and support a diverse and inclusive community for planetary sciences across Europe, underpinned by 10 Regional Hubs.
- Raise awareness of planetary sciences through outreach, education and policy engagement.
- Strengthen the leading role of Europe in planetary sciences by developing links with academia and industry at national and international levels.

The Europlanet Society's **European Planetary Science Congress** (EPSC) is the **largest annual meeting** for planetary sciences in Europe.

The day-to-day running of the Europlanet Society is managed by the Europlanet Society Executive Office, hosted by the European Science Foundation (ESF) in Strasbourg, France.

## Corporate membership

Corporate membership is open to **any institution, organisation or association** involved in planetary sciences or related fields.
